17th June, World Day to Combat Desertification and Drought:

This is a very important Day to celebration. Due to the Climate Change a drastic change we can see. In somewhere there are heavy rain which causes of flood and other parts there are drought. On this day we have run a poster campaign through social media to make the eco system healthy by reducing carbon emotion, stop burning plastics, conserve the water etc.

22nd June: Observation of World Rainforest Day:

The rainforest produces oxygen is an important part of the planet we live in and helps adequately boost carbon dioxide contributing to climate change. environment related issue in our welfare society. We have been observing this day to aware about the smart management and ill-effect of single used plastics (SUPs). On this occasion, we have been distributing cloths bags to minimize the use of SUPs. We are also engaging the local SHGs' women to make cloth bags and distribute among the people and encourage others to use the cloth bags in place of plastic bags. There are some others activities like miking, postering etc. taken to create the mass awareness.

11 July,: International Population Day:

Reduce the crowd over earth for a better future. The increasing population is toxic to the earth's environment, its create unemployment and other problems to everyone life. Overpopulation is the overload on the planet; let's pledge to reduce the load. Birth control is the only solution to population control. On the occasion of World Population Day, an interaction and a rally were conducted lastly a memorandum was sent to the Prime Minister under the leadership of Population Solution Foundation for enforcing the Population Control Act. through District Commissioner of Nalbari.

16th July, World Snake day:

Nature creates Snakes to keep maintain the natural balance. Data says, if there is no snakes then we can live only 19 years on this planet, because snake maintain the pollution of rodent and other harmfull animals. Otherwise the harmful animals population will destroy the agricultural corps and we will be suffering in hunger. So, snake maintains the ecology. 29th July, International Tiger Day:

Awareness and River Cleaning Programme: Rivers the source of fresh water is worsening by various human activities, like solid waste, chemical waste, immersion of *pooja* goods, caracas of animals etc. are directly or indirectly goes to the river by us, which is the cause of river pollution. That is why we human must have to know or realize that we are doing wrong. From 2019 we are working for aware people about not to pollute the rivers as it is one of main source of fresh water. Secondly, we are cleaning some *ghat* of rivers after immersion of idols and others non bio degradable waste.

Save the River Dolphin: The State and National Aquatic animals Gangetic River (platanista gangetica) Dolphin found in very limited rivers, once it was migrate almost in Brahmaputra's all tributaries. But, their habitat destruction and polluted or maybe filling of the beels, pond their food fish, shrimp, prawn, decrease day by day, Basically, wildlife needs food and habitat for living. In Southeast Asia River Kulshi or Kolohi is one of the major habitats. But, due to several human activities the habitat are endanger. So, we are working for the conservation of this indicator species.

Importance of Biodiversity: Interaction about the importance of biodiversity secretary Rajesh Dutta Baruah interacted with the future generations about the importance of biodiversity conservation along with water, uses of single use plastic etc. at Sishapith High School, Boko, Kamrup (R). Where around 150 students participate the

programme. Teachers of the schools and honrary environment activist Sri Sarangadhar Rabha and othr teachers appreciated the programme.

Beekeeping: As we know that Honey Bee is the one of the most important and helpful living being in this planet, it's also generate employment too by selling of its honey to the people. As per our organization objectives we have promoted these things and working with the Abadari Federation of Farmers Interested Group of Honey Production, Baganpara, we have been distributed Bee box to the cultivator and promoting the pure honey.

Jal Jeevan Implementation Support Agency:

Jal Jeevan Mission on 15 August, 2019 from Red Ford, New Dehli. The aim of the Mission is to provide safe drinking water to the all rural house hold of India by 2024. To keep it in this mind the state nodal agency in Assam Public Health and Engineering Department recruit some best NGO, Trust etc. to make this objective success as Implementation Support Agency (ISA). In Nalbari dist, we have working in 60 nos. village under 4 development block. Where we mainly focuses Information, Education and Communication (IEC) about Jal Jeevan Mission.

Awareness Programme on Safe Drinking Water and Grey Water Management:

Water is life, but all are not. If we drink contaminate water it can be cause of disease. So, we must have to understand the different between safe drinking water and contaminate water. For that we are working to identify the differences of drinking water along with grey water management.

Awareness Programme on Swachhata Hi Seva: Awareness Cum Interaction, Human Chain, Quiz competition Bicycle Rally, Cleanliness drive, River cleaning Programme on Swachhata Hi Seva was organized among the students, teachers, community public, SHG etc. of various parts like Kaithakuchi, Khuida, Naddi, Balikoriya, Amani, Arara, Paila etc. of Nalbari district. 




