Activities Details of The Green Globe (TGG), 2024-2025

1. Nature Camps:

Two days Nature Camp conducted at Ghoga Beel, Nalbari Assam on 20 & 21st, March, 2025. There were 40 Nos. of students from Eco Club Banbhag Balika High School, Banbhag Khata Dijhari Higher Secondary School, Dhamdhama Higher Secondary School and Silpotabari High School along with few local students participated the programme. Before the begining the progrmme the all students are exange in 5 groups name Kesu (earthworm), Sorai (birds), Moumakhi (honey bee), Xap (snake), Tholuwa Mas (indigenous fish).

On the first day there were Inaugural session and Introduce of Lifestyle for Environment or MISSION LIFE (INCLUDING CARBON FOOTPRINT, VERMICOMPOSTING, SOURCE SEGREGATION AND UP-CYCLING OF WASTES etc.) by Biswajit Sharma, President, The Green Globe. Where he also a brief presentation on the camping site, its biodiversity and ecological significance. The next programme was Fun for Learn, where the students got a task that they have to write a drama on Nature Conservation and then they have to play it. The programme was very much effevtive in the sense of involvement themselves for protection of Nature. Last session of the day screening of Documentary on Forest, Wildlife and Environment.

On the second day early in the morning the students got trekking in to the surrounding area of Ghoga beel leading by the Sri Prasanna Kalita #Bonybondhu, wildlife activist from Dakhin Kamrup, Chhaygaon, where he take class on, how to observe and count birds, during the bird watching there were 49 nos of various birds species counted. Later. He also interacted and introduced the snakes of Assam. Sri Pankaj Lochan Deka, coordinator of The Green Globe and head of the Elephant conservation and research wing interacted with the students about Elephant. At the last session Sri Rajesh Dutta Baruah, secretary and coordinator of EEP, Nalbari Assam interacted about the experience from the students, Sri Jyotshna Deka, Eco Club, Banbhag Balika High School have sharing her feedback that she and her class mate was very helpful from this camp. At the end of valedictory session Dr.Diganta Gowsami attend the programme and distribute the certificates.

The entire programme was graced by the presence of Annadata Sri Tapan Dutta Baruah, Sri Hemen Choudhary UDA, Inspector of Schools, Nalbari.

To minimize all type of WASTE, the entire programme is conducted through "ZERO WASTE PRACTICES".

2. International Mother Earth Day Celebration:

On the activity of this auspicious day, a awareness program conducted by Eco Club and Department of Zoology, Nalbari College in collaboration with The Green Globe on 22.04.2024 supported by Ministry of Environment Forest and Climate Change, Govt. of India and Assam Science Technology and Environment Council, Assam. Secretary of The Green Globe, Mr. Rajesh Dutta Baruah interacted with the students about how we can manage the uses of plastics in this time. Plastics are a great invention of humans, but secretary Globe

human are not use it well so it's going to be a headache now for the entire World, Baruah also show them that how we can manege the single use plastics through MOBILE DUSTBIN. Sri Kumud Ch Rabha, Head of Department Zoology, Dr. Dhiraj Talukdar Coordinator Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Nalbari College, along with Dr. Debasri Tamuli and Dr. Bidyut Das Asst. Professor and students are present at the program.

- 3. Vermi Composting Livelihood Program: As we all know one of the best manure is vermi compost, which is playing a major role in organic farming revolution. TGG has been generating awareness about the importance of vermin compost and its scope as alternative livelihood activities in human elephant conflict areas. We are organizing different levels of awareness program on vermin compost and urge people to accept this simple technology of livelihood.
- 4. Awareness on Mitigation of Human Elephant Conflicts (HEC): We have been organizing different field level awareness campaign in HEC affected areas to reduce conflicts cases. There are different modes of awareness based on the situation demands. There are various sections of awareness campaign like Community Level, Youth Programs, School Level, etc., so that all sections of society can be reached to mitigate HEC. Such type of issue need collective action from all sections of society, we are always collaborate some local NGOs, Rural Local Bodies (RLBs), Forest Departments, etc.
- 5. World Honey Bee Day: This day is observed by our organization to aware the mass people about nature conservation with sustainable livelihood generation. This day is also important to observe to give support to the local bee keepers in rural community level, as they have been practicing a sustainable livelihood modes of income. The observation of this day is also important to give market link of their products which is always an encouraging side of any producers.

District Level Exhibition on Sustainable Products/Models/Ideas :

District Level Exhibition cum Competition on Sustainable Products/ Models/ Ideas under Environment Education Program (EEP) on the Topic "Sustainable and Waste Free Eco Club Campus" was organised by The Green Globe at Debiram Pathsala Higher Secondary School, Nalbari. The implementation agency of the Program is Assam Science Technology & Environment Council (Assam) and supported by Ministry of Environment Forest & Climate Change, Government of India. Under the Environment Education Program (EEP), there are 29 numbers of schools and colleges participating the program, where 2 (Two) selected representative students from each institutions had demonstrated there Projects/ Models/ Ideas on Sustainable. The top three winners are-

First- Keshab Narayan Jnanpith High School, Second- Asomi High School and Third- Govt. Gurdon Higher Secondary School.

The main concept of the Exhibition is to aware the students about the Waste Management and Segregation. There Model/ Ideas/ Project are based on the Waste to Wealth, so that the ill-impact of single used plastics (SUPs) can be reduced. As, we all know burning of SUPs is a great



threat to Air Pollution and Global Warming and Nalbari is one of the ranked in Air pollution too. But, this is a common practice for our people living in cities, towns or rural areas. This problem can be solved by proper management of these SUPs by upcycling them to some wealth. Also in the Mid Day Meal (MDM) system there some also generat degradeable waste, which is also can convert to the organic mannure or vermi compost that's the second important concern of the programme too. This exhibition helps them to aware about the proper manage of Single used plastics with is a prime concern for sustainable development. To understand the concept of sustainable development, the main theme is decided by the Ministry is "Sustainable and Waste Free Eco Club Campus".

Inspector of Schools Nalbari Sri Jayanta Thakuria, Sri Malem Sinha Assam Science Technology and Environment Council, Ghy and Principal of Debiram Pathsala Higher Secondary School Sri Ajit Sarma are presented the program and are given their individual speech about Sustainable Development and SUPs which encourages the participants.

- 7. World Bicycle Day: Every year, we have been observing this day to aware about the importance of cycling need to practice for nature conservation and for healthy life styles. This year, we had organized this day in collaboration with Regional Office, Kamrup: Pollution Control Board, Assam at Nalbari town. A rally was organized from Gordon School Playground, where different schools' students, some local cyclists, delegates from TGG and PCBA. Mr. Dipak Das, one of the famous Assamese Singer and one of the famous cyclist flag off the rally and urged the people to accept the habits of cycling for sustainable life style.
- 8. World Environment Day: In this financial year, we had organized different activities on the occasion of World Environment Day in two different districts and locations/venues. One we had organized at Rangia Girls Higher Secondary School in Kamrup (Rural) district in collaboration with Regional Office, Kamrup: Pollution Control Board, Assam in this Proff. .Kumud Ch Rabha, HoD, Dept. of Zoology, Nalbari College. Another program we had organized in Tamulpur District at PMShri Nagrijuli High School in collaboration with North Zone Central Elephant Protection Committee (NZCEPC), Shasastra Seema Bal (SSB), Eco Club, where Sri Ranjit Konwar, Divisional Forest Officer, Baksa grace the programme as a chief guest.
- 9. Awareness Program on Solid Waste Management and Rain Water Harvesting Program: Solid Waste Management and Rain Water Harvesting are most essential points of discussion in our present society. We have been organized awareness program in all level to aware about the source segregation to manage our solid waste and can adopt some simple methods to harvest our rain water.
- 10. Observation of International Plastic Beg Free Day: This day is observed to aware about the alarming ill-impact of Single Used Plastic (SUP) Bags to our environment. We have been observing this day by organizing awareness meetings, talks, street plays, so that the message need to be spread in a right way. We have also designed a cloth named "I M MO'NA", and distribute among the people and asked people to refuse and replace SUP Bags. Here we had

- engaged some Self Help Groups (SHGs) women to prepare these bags, so that we can give some seasonal livelihood engagement.
- 11. Plantation / Maintenance of Trees: Every year, we have been planting saplings in a scientific ways and spend lots of efforts and sources to maintain them well. Even we have been maintaining and taking care off others sapling and trees planted by other organization and government agencies. In this year we have been planting more than 5000 saplings under Amrit brikhy Andolan.
- **12.**World Population Day: This day we have been organizing different rallies, poster campaign, talks, etc., to aware about the ill-impact of rising population. We have regularly sending memorandum to Central Government to implement a strict population law to control our population growth.
- 13. Free Distribution of Search Lights to the people of Human Elephants Conflict(HEC): We as an Environment Related organization have been giving our best effort to support the people living in the vulnerable areas of HEC. We have providing some logistics support to those people who are living in those areas of HEC. These search lights are very fruitful to find the exact location of elephants movement which help to reduce the HEC. We are collaborated with different organizations to cooperate affected people with these logistics items.
- 14.World Snake Day: "Emphasizes the critical role snakes play in the environment and how they can be good neighbours by controlling pest populations and contributing to biodiversity" The Green Globe have organised an awareness cum interaction program about the importance of Snakes to our environment at Balitara Jagannath Mandir premises. Mr. Biswajit Sharma president have welcome speech and Rajesh Dutta Baruah interact as resource person. Coordinator Pankaj Lochan Deka, Diganta Roy from TGG, Piyush Sharma Snake rescuer, Utpal Kalita, Hirak Rajbongshi, Pramod Kalita, Brajen Das from Elephant Protection Committee present as the members of organizing committee. The people have appreciated the program as they are know many things from this program. They mentioned that such program help to reduce superstitious beliefs about the Snakes bites.
- 15. Free Eye Screening Camp: Every year, we have been organizing different health camps in community level. This session we had organized various level of health related programs in school and community level. This session we had organized a Free Eye Screening Camp at Tamulpur District in collaboration with Sankardev Netralaya, Guwahati, In this program, all section of people in the region were participated and staffs from Sarkardev Netralaya put their best effort to treat the villagers. There are 72 people benefited through this camp.
- **16.**Awareness of E-Waste: The awareness campaigns on e-waste have been providing by our organization. This is a new concept and many not accept e-waste as waste. The Bin Bag a recycler of E Waste have help us the solve the problem of this hazardous pollutin.
- 17.'Ek Ped Hathi Ke Naam' Campaign: This is our own designed slogan to mitigate HEC. The main objective of thr program is to provide Elephant consumable fodder tho their natural habitat. The campaign was launched by Sri Bidyut Bikas Bhawati, District Commisiner, Tamulpur on 12 th June in the year 2024. Presently we are targeting in Indo-Bhutan boarder of Tamulpur and

Baksa district of BTR (Assam). In this campaign, we have been getting a massive support from District Administration, local people, organization, etc.

- 18. Distribution Field Gears to EPC members: We have been distributing shoes and raincoats to our members of Elephant Protection Committee (EPC). As these EPC members have been monitoring the movement of elephants and sharing information to the forest officials to take some necessary steps to reduce HEC. They are very active in field and need some necessary field equipments. So, with the support of Aranyak we have distributed to the grass root workers.
- 19. World Elephant Day: This day is observed to aware about the elephants conservation and to mitigate the Human Elephant Conflicts. We have been organizing different activities on this day among the people and school students of HEC vulnerable areas. The 25024 World Elephant Day was conducted at Nagrijuli Senior Seconary School and the chief guest was Sri Bidyut Bikas Bhawati, District Commisiner, Tamulpur

20. World Ozone Day:

On the upcoming of World Ozone Day an awareness cum interaction program organised by Regional Office: Kamrup, Pollution Control Board, Assam (PCBA) in collaboration with The Green Globe at Milan High School, Arikuchi, Dist- Nalbari (Assam).

In the open session, PCBA officials Sri Mamoni Goswami, Executive Engineer RO. - **24.** Awareness on Honey Bee cum Honey Production: Importance of honey bee for our nature and its honey for our health, that are main motive for us to aware in large scale. We are also help the bee keepers to get their proper market linkage.






